Almond, Flowering ○

(4-5' tall x 3-4' wide) Zone 4-8

Prunus glandulosa 'Rosa Plena'

Double pink flowers in early spring. Bright

Green shiny leaves. Good shrub near house or patio.

Prefers slightly acid to neutral soil; well-drained soil.

Prune after flowering.

Apple, Cortland ○

(10 – 15' tall and wide) Zone 4-7

Malus 'Cortland'

Ripens late September, mid-season bloom. Crisp, juicy, slightly acid flesh. Good for cooking & eating.

Needs pollinator. Prefers moist, well-drained soil.

Prune Feb./Mar.

Apple, Honeycrisp ○

(20' tall x 20' wide) Zone 4-7

Malus 'Honeycrisp'

Ripens late September. Mid-season bloomer. Hard, crisp, juicy flesh with sweet flavor. Keeps well.

Excellent for eating. Good for pies, baking and sauce. Needs pollinator. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb / March.

Apple, Lodi ○

(8-10' tall x 8'-10' wide) Zone 4

Malus 'Lodi'

Dwarf, heirloom variety. Matures in early summer.

Apples have a crisp white flesh and are prized for pies and sauce. Needs pollinator. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb/March.

Apple, McIntosh ○

(10 – 15' tall and wide) Zone 4-7

Malus 'McIntosh'

Ripens late September. Mid-season bloomer. Crisp, juicy, white flesh. Heavy bearer. Good for eating and desserts. Needs pollinator.

Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb./Mar.

Apple, Wolf River ○

(8-10' tall) Zone 4

Malus 'Wolf River'

Dwarf. Heirloom variety that produces huge 1 lb. apples. Good quality, multi-purpose apple. Best for baking and fresh eating. Mid-season bloomer. Needs pollinator. Prefers moist, well-drained soil.

Prune Feb/Mar.

Apple, Zester ○

(8-10' tall) Zone 4

Malus 'Zester'

Dwarf. This large apple is crisp, juicy and full of flavor. Skin color is red with yellow background. Good for fresh eating and baking. Keeps well.

Ripens in early August. Mid-season bloomer.

Needs pollinator. Prefers moist-well-drained soil.

Prune Feb/Mar.

Arborvitae, Emerald Green ○

(10 -15' tall x 3- 4' wide) Zone 3-8

Thuja occidentalis 'Emerald Green'

Pyramidal form. Emerald green foliage. Holds color well throughout the winter. Prefers slightly acidic soil. Prune only dead or damaged branches. Can lightly shear 1" before growth starts in Spring. Protect from winter burn in windy areas with Wilt-Pruf.

Arborvitae, Hetz Midget ○

(2-3' tall x 3' wide) Zone 3-8

T. occidentalis 'Hetz Midget'

Small, dense globe-shaped evergreen. Rich green, finely textured foliage. Very slow grower. Keeps shape without pruning. Prefers moist, acidic, well-drained soil, but adaptable to all soil types. Prune only dead or damaged branches.

Arborvitae, Holmstrup ○

(5-6' tall x 2-3' wide) Zone 3-8

Thuja occidentalis 'Holmstrup'

A very compact evergreen with a natural pyramidal shape. Slow-growing. Heavy seeder. Prefers moist, acidic well-drained soil, but adaptable to all soil types. Prune only dead or damaged branches. Can lightly shear 1" before growth starts in Spring. Protect from winter burn in windy areas with Wilt-Pruf.

Arborvitae, Mr. Bowling Ball ○

(3' tall x 3' wide) Zone 3-7

Thuja occidentalis 'Mr. Bowling Bowl'

Very unique dwarf variety of Arborvitae with a striking fan shaped foliage. Prefers slightly acidic soil. No pruning necessary. Protect from winter burn in windy areas with Wilt-Pruf.

*Arborvitae, Sherwood Frost ○

(4'-5' tall x 2-3' wide) Zone 4

Thuja occidentalis 'Sherwood Frost'

Slow growing, broad upright cultivar whose foliage tips are brushed a light cream-white color. The variegated foliage radiates on a clear, sunny winter day. Great accent plant. Prefers slightly acidic soil. Prune only dead or damaged branches. Can lightly shear 1" before growth starts in Spring. Protect from winter burn in windy areas with Wilt-Pruf.

*Arborvitae, Steeplechase ○

(20' tall by 8' wide) Zone 4-8

Thuja x 'Steeplechase'

Dense, broad, pyramidal evergreen with fine, textured foliage. Great hedge plant. Best used to cover unsightly land spaces. Great wind break and sound barrier. Alternative to Italian Cypress. No pruning necessary. Needs regular watering, more often in extreme heat when establishing new location. Protect from winter burn in windy areas with Wilt-Pruf.

Arborvitae, Techny ○

(Common Name: Mission Arborvitae)

(12-15' tall x 6-8' wide) Zone 4

Thuja occidentalis 'Techny'

Pyramidal, dependable, cold hardy variety. Retains green color well into winter. Foliage is resistant to winter burn which makes it a popular selection in Wisconsin weather. Prefers slightly acidic soil. Prune only dead or damaged branches. Can lightly shear 1" before growth starts in spring. Protect from winter burn in windy areas with Wilt-Pruf.

Arborvitae, Winter Green ○

(20-30' tall x 5-10' wide) Zone 3

Thuja occidentalis 'Winter Green'

Dense columnar pyramid with branches full to the ground. Shiny bright green foliage. One stem growth, will not split. Drought tolerant once established. Well-drained soil. Prune only dead or damaged branches. Can lightly shear 1" before growth starts in Spring. Protect from winter burn in windy areas with Wilt-Pruf.

Ash, Korean Mountain ○

(20-40' tall x 15-25' wide) Zone 4-7

Sorbus alnifolia 'Korean Mtn.'

Broad, rounded shape with smooth grey bark. 3" diameter clusters of tiny white blossoms in Spring (bi-yearly) are followed by showy 5" pendulous clusters of red to yellow fruits. Glossy bright green leaves turn yellow, orange and rust in fall. Fruits cling to tree branches long after leaves disappear in fall. Migratory birds love the fruit. Prefers acidic, well-drained, loamy soil. Prune in Feb/March.

Ash, Showy Mountain ○

(20-25' tall x 20' wide) Zone 2

Sorbus decora 'Showy Mountain'

Handsome foliage and showy red fruit. Extremely hardy. Slow growing and disease resistant. Native. Prefers acidic, well-drained, loamy soil. Prune in Feb/March.

Aspen, Quaking ○

(40-50' tall x 20-30' wide) Zone 2-7

Populus tremuloides

Greenish to white bark. Leaves quake in the slightest breeze. Fast growing. Multiplies to form groves. Gorgeous yellow fall color. Native. Good for naturalizing. Prefers moist, well-drained soil; pH adaptable. Prune Feb/March.

Aspen, Souixland ○

(75' tall x 35' wide) Zone 2

Populus deltoides 'Souixland'

Oval shaped, fast growing tree. Medium green summer foliage. Yellow fall color. Prefers moist, well-drained soil; pH adaptable. Prune Feb/March.

Azalea, Mandarin Lights ●●

(4-5' tall x wide) Zone 4-7

Rhododendron x 'Mandarin Lights'

Upright rounded shrub with bright mandarin orange blossoms in spring. Bronze fall foliage.

Prefers acidic soil. Prune right after flowering, if needed. Use Wilt-Pruf for winter protection.

Azalea, Orchid Lights ●●

(2'-4' tall x 2'-4' wide) Zone 4

Rhododendron x 'Orchid Lights'

Orchid pink flowers in spring. Excellent fall color.

Prefers filtered light. Prefers acidic soil.

Prune right after flowering, if needed. Use Wilt-Pruf for winter protection.

Azalea, Rosy Lights ●●

(4-5' tall x 5-6' wide) Zone 4-7

Rhododendron x 'Rosy Lights'

Spreading shrub with dark rosy pink flowers in late May or early June. Prefers acidic soil. Prune right after flowering, if needed. Use Wilt-Pruf for winter protection.

Bald Cypress, Cascade Falls ○●

(6-8' tall x 8-10' wide) Zone 4-8

Taxodium distichum 'Cascade Falls'

A spectacular weeping form with beautiful soft green, cascading foliage. Staking the leading shoot determines the ultimate height and spread. Branches are clothed in deciduous, linear, emerald-green leaves which turn a bronze-yellow in fall.

Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb./March.

Barberry, Bonanza Gold ○

(2' tall x 2' wide) Zone 4-7

B. thunbergii 'Bogozam'

A dwarf barberry with vivid yellow foliage, whose leaves will not burn in the sun. Can readily shear as a hedge. Prefers well-drained soil; not wet. Prune dead or damaged branches as needed.

Barberry, Concorde ○

(2' tall x 2-3' wide) Zone 4-8

B. thunbergii 'Concorde'

Smallest purple cultivar. Rounded form. Small yellow flowers in spring followed by red fruits. Great tiny hedge or as a front border plant.

Prefers well-drained soil; not wet. Prune dead or damaged branches as needed.

Barberry, Crimson Pygmy ○

(2-3' tall x wide) Zone 4-8

B. thunbergii 'Crimson Pygmy'

Compact mounded plant with deep red foliage and orange-scarlet fall color. Good for low foundation or hedge plant. Prefers well-drained soil; not wet.

Prune only dead or damaged branches.

***Barberry, Golden Ruby** ○

(2' tall x 2' wide) Zone 4-8

B. thunbergii 'Goruzam'

A beautiful, slow-growing compact plant with striking coral-orange foliage. Late season foliage accented with a golden margin. Great for mass plantings or as an eye-catching contrast.

Prefers well-drained soil; not wet. Prune only dead or damaged branches.

Barberry, Helmond Pillar ○

(4-5' tall x 1-2' wide) Zone 4-8

B. thunbergii 'Helmond Pillar'

Upright columnar form that features red-purple foliage. Effective in a perennial planting. Prefers well-drained soil and full sun for best color.

Prune only dead or damaged branches.

Barberry, Rosy Glow ○

(3-4' Tall and 3' wide) Zone 4

Berberis thunbergii 'Rose Glow'

A nice Barberry that can be used as an accent or a hedge. The foliage turns a variegated pink, white and red. It provides a constant color all season long.

Prefers well-drained soil, not wet. Prune only dead or damaged branches.

B. thunbergii 'Royal Burgundy'

Rich burgundy small velvety leaves that hold their color through summer, changing to black in fall.

Prefers well-drained soil, not wet. Prune only dead or damaged branches.

(3-4' tall x 3-4' wide) Zone 4-8

B. thunbergii 'Maria'

Leaves emerge red, changing bright yellow foliage that retains good golden yellow color all summer and does not scorch. Excellent orange-red fall color.

Prefers well-drained soil, not wet. Prune only dead or damaged branches.

***Barberry, Sunstation** ○

(3' tall x 4' wide) Zone 4

Berberis thuberii. 'Sunstation'

Golden foliage with an orange cast most of the season. Drought tolerant. Prefers well-drained soil, not wet. Prune only dead or damaged branches.

***Bayberry, Northern** ○◎

(6-9' tall x 6-9' wide) Zone 4-7

Myrica pensylvanica

Dark green foliage, aromatic when crushed.

Clusters of gray, waxy berries on female plants which persist into winter. Berries can be used to make candles. Tolerates wet sites, dry sites, windy sites and salt. Use as a border, for massing or as a screen. Birds love the berries. Need male plant to pollinate female plant. Prefers slightly acid soil. Prune in March or April to keep leaves closely spaced.

Beech, Purple Fountain ◎

(15' tall x 15' wide) Zone 5

Fagus sylvatica 'Purple Fountain'

Combination of European and Common Beech.

Narrow, upright growth; cascading branches; purple foliage may fade in hot sun; Gray bark looks like elephant hide in mature trees. Prefers semi-shade location. Prefers moist, well-drained acidic soil.

Does not like wet locations. Prune in summer or early Fall.

(50' tall x 40' wide) Zone 5

Fagus sylvatica 'Riversii'

Deep purple leaves hold their color into summer months, turning purple-green late in the season. Gray bark looks like elephant hide in mature trees. Prefers semi-shade location. Prefers moist, well-drained acidic soil. Does not like wet locations. Prune in summer or early Fall.

Birch, Heritage, River ○

(40-50' Tall x 25-40' wide)

Betula nigra 'Heritage'

Distinctive bark provides visual interest year-round with its papery cinnamon bark and graceful crown.

Leaves turn bright yellow in the fall. The Heritage Birch grows very rapidly; is very cold hardy and tolerant of flooding and drought. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb/March.

***Birch, Heritage, River, Cully** ○

(60' tall x 40' wide) Zone 4-9

Betula nigra 'Cully' Heritage

Fabulous pyramidal accent tree for the garden.

Male catkin accents in spring; glossy dark green leaves turn creamy yellow in fall. Bark is multicolored ranging from cream to salmon, orange-red to cinnamon-brown. Birch grows very rapidly; is very cold hardy and tolerant of flooding and drought. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb/March.

Birch, Little King, Fox Valley, River ○

(8-10' tall x 12' wide) Zone 4-9

Betula nigra 'Little King'

Small, low-branched tree with broad pyramidal form. Limb up to expose pale salmon and cinnamon-red exfoliating bark. Seedless. Excellent resistance to bronze birch borer. Pale yellow-gold fall foliage. Prefers moist, slightly acidic soil. Adapts well to most soils. Heat and drought tolerant. Prune Feb. / March.

Birch, Renaissance Oasis ○

(50-70' tall x 30-40' wide) Zone 3-7

Betula papyrifera 'Renaissance Oasis'

Paper birch. Broad, dense, pyramidal form. Most derough tolerant variety of the Renaissance series. Juvenile bark is outstanding reddish-bronze, turning white with attractive exfoliation. Yellow fall leaves. Birch borer resistant. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb/March.

Birch, Royal Frost ○

(30-35' tall x 20-25' wide) Zone 3

Betula 'Royal Frost'

Upright pyramidal form with strong central leader. Deep purplish-red foliage. Cross between White Birch and Crimson Frost Birch. "Frost" white exfoliating bark. Resistant to bronze birch borer. Great ornamental tree. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb/March.

Birch, Whitespire ○

(30-40' tall x 20-25' wide) Zone 3-7

Betula platyphylla 'Whitespire'

Glossy, dark green leaves. Chalk white bark that does not exfoliate. Resistant to bronze birch borer. Thrives under a wide variety of soil conditions and tolerant of warmer locations. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb/March.

Betula pendula 'Youngii'

European. Interesting asymmetrical branching habit. Suited for small garden area. Dark green foliage turning a wonderful yellow in fall. Keep moist in long, hot summers. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb/March.

*Bittersweet Vine (Male and Female part) ○

(15-25' vine) Zone 2-8

Celastrus scandans 'American Revolution'

This plant is a revolutionary breakthrough. The flowers formed on this vine are perfect, meaning the flower itself has both male and female parts. You only need to purchase one plant which has both pollinators. Berry size is 2x other varieties. Fruit is orange-red. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune in late Fall or early Spring. Don't prune more than 25% of vine per growing season.

Rhodotypos scandens

A nice rugged shrub for shaded areas. Kerria-like double white blooms in summer, followed by jet black berries which persist through the winter. Shears well. Tolerant of urban pollutants. Prefers moist, well-drained soil; pH adaptable. Prune after flowering.

(1-1/2' Tall and 2 1/2' Wide)

Andromeda polifolia 'Nana'

Dwarf evergreen with powder blue, rosemary-like foliage with small bell shaped flowers. Excellent groundcover. Great on marsh and pond banks. Likes to be cool and moist. Prefers moist, lime-free, moisture retentive soil. Prune after flowering, if needed.

Boxwood, Green Gem ☺●

(1.5 – 2' tall x 1.5 – 2' wide) Zone 5-9

Buxus 'Green Gem'

Hybrid of *Buxus Koreana* and *Buxus sempervirens*. Very slow grower. Known for its globular shape and excellent winter hardiness; more resistant to winter burn. Prefers sun-dappled part shade and moist, sandy loam, slightly acidic, well-drained soil. No salt! Use Wilt-Pruf for winter protection.

(5' -7' tall x 2'-3' wide) Zone 5

Buxus sempervirens 'Monrue'

An improved upright narrow variety. Lustrous green foliage does not brown out in winter. An excellent hedge for tight places or in a formal garden. Can be pruned into a topiary. Do not plant in windy locations. Prefers moist, sandy loam, slightly acidic, well-drained soil. Prefers moist, sandy loam, slightly acidic, well-drained soil. No salt! Can be lightly sheared. Prefers moist, sandy loam, slightly acidic, well-drained soil. Prefers moist, sandy loam, slightly acidic, well-drained soil. No salt! Can be sheared. Use Wilt-Pruf for winter protection.

Rhamnus frangula 'Fine Line'

Prefers part shade. A great small tree for small areas, with fern-like leaves. Unique. Deer resistant. Cold hardy and heat tolerant. Prefers well-drained soil; pH adaptable. No pruning required.

(5-6' tall x wide) Zone 4-8

Euonymus alatus 'Compactus'

Bushy, compact, rounded plant. Brilliant scarlet fall color. Best in full sun. Fall color becomes more pinkish in shade. Excellent for hedges. Plant in full sun for best color. Prefers well-drained soil; pH adaptable. We suggest winter protection against rabbits. Prune any time of the year.

(3-5' tall and wide) Zone 5-8

Euonymus alatus 'Rudy Haag'

More compact than 'Compactus'. Summer leaves are a rich even green on a tidy mounded form. Produces uniquely textured bark with intense red fall foliage. Plant in full sun for best fall color. Use as specimen or in mixed borders. Fall color shows off well against evergreens or darker surfaces. We suggest winter protection against rabbits. Prefers well-drained soil; pH adaptable. Prune anytime of the year.

Bushclover, 'Gibraltar' ○◎

(4-6' tall x 6-8' wide) Zone 4

Lespedeza thunbergii 'Gibraltar'

Smooth textured blue-green foliage. Blooms profusely late summer to early fall with many pink-violet flowers. Water regularly, but do not overwater. Prefers any type soil; pH adaptable.

Prune annually, cut back to 6" above the ground in April.

Caragana, Walker Weeping ○◎

(5' tall x 3-5' wide) Zones 3-8

Caragana arborescens 'Walker'

Grafted on a standard stalk. Leaves have a fern-like appearance. Strongly weeping habit. Bright yellow spring blooming flowers. Moderate to slow growth. Prefers moist, well-drained soil; pH adaptable.

Prune after flowering.

Cherry, Kwanzan ○

(25-30' tall x 25-30' wide) Zone 5-9

Prunus serrulatta 'Kwanzan'

Hardy and well-known, vase-shaped specimen.

Combines show-stopping flowering with great foliage and habit. Double pink flowers are abundant in spring as foliage begins to appear. Bronze colored foliage turns dark green and then to orange in fall.

Prefers well-drained soil. Prune Feb/March.

*Cherry, Mesabi ○

(10-20' tall x 15-20' wide) Zone 4-8.

Prunus 'Mesabi'

A sweet-tart, long stemmed cherry with sugar content between pie cherries and Bing cherries.

Fruit resembles Meteor but pit is smaller. Fruit begins to ripen mid-July. Self-fertile, but more fruit produced with 2nd pollinator. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune Feb./March.

Cherry, Weeping ○

(15' tall x 20' wide) Zone 4-9

Prunus sub. 'Weeping Cherry'.

Great ornamental specimen plant. Beautiful white blossoms on weeping branches in Spring. Produces a few unnoticeable, persistent fruits. Prefers well-drained soil. Prune Feb/March.

Chokeberry, Black 'Autumn Magic' ○◎

(3-5' tall x 2-4' wide) Zone 3-7

Aronia melanocarpa 'Autumn Magic'

Upright flowering shrub with fragrant white blooms in May followed by clusters of large, edible dark purple/black berries. Berries persist through the season. Dark glossy green foliage. Red/purple fall color. Birds love it! Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Prune after flowering.

Aronia arbutifolia 'Brillantissima'

Use in shrub borders, winter interest or wildlife attraction. Prefers moist, acidic, organic soils. Does well in light or heavy soils. Prune Feb./ March.
